This court, by order of 5/29/09, asked for supplemental briefing addressing why this appeal should not be dismissed. A copy of that order is attached as Appendix A. Having considered the supplemental briefs filed by the parties and amici, this court concludes:

- 1. The underlying due process issue is not properly before this court, because appellant did not appeal the due process ruling and appellee Alaska Court System did not cross-appeal, and because any due process issue arising out of the GAL appointment does not raise an issue about whether due process requires appointment of counsel when the other party has private counsel. Any ruling on the underlying due process issue would therefore be purely advisory, and not in context of an actual case or controversy.
- 2. All issues are mooted by the conclusion of the initial custody dispute.

3. The public interest exception does not justify appellate consideration

of the mooted or unpreserved issues in this case, even though the party and

amicus briefing has been of the highest quality. The court considers it

unlikely that the issues, including the critical due process issue, will evade

direct appellate or interlocutory review in an actual case or controversy.

The court likewise considers it unlikely that the issues will be mooted out

when they do recur. The court also anticipates that some agency or branch

of the State of Alaska, as the entity ultimately responsible for paying for

counsel appointed in such a case, will actively participate when the dispute

recurs.

Consequently, IT IS ORDERED:

1. This appeal is **DISMISSED**.

2. The parties are to bear their own costs and fees.
